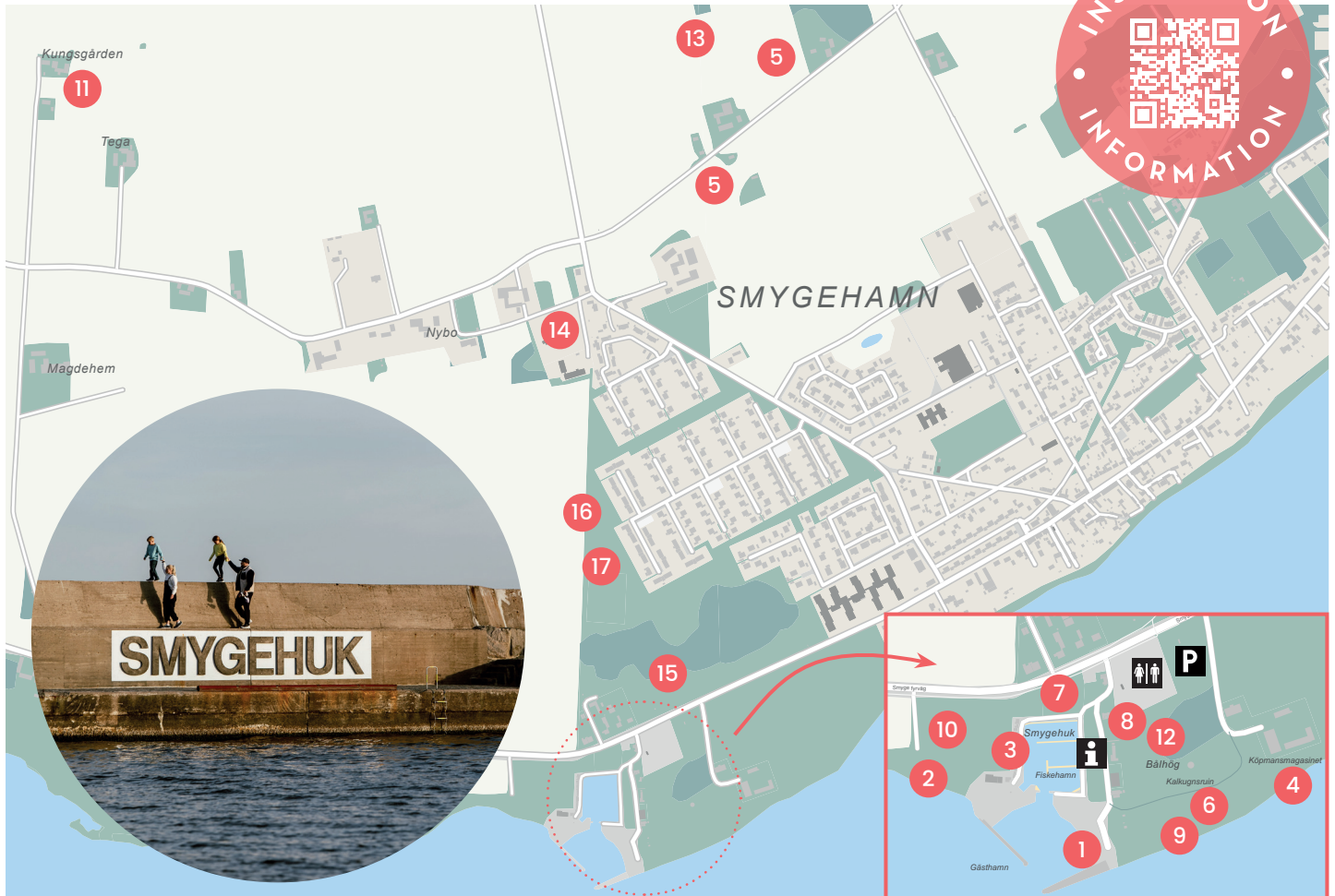


Smygehuk Guide

Smygehuk is located on Sweden's southernmost point with a magnificent view over the sea to the horizon. Visitors from all over the world love Smygehuk for its close proximity to the ocean, nature, cultural life and feeling of freedom. In the summer months the region is alive with concerts, events, art exhibitions, culture and shopping. During the winter it is transformed into a work of art made from ice and snow.



1. Sweden's southernmost point

Viewing platform with compass rose, binoculars, benches, and bbq area.

2. Smygehuk Lighthouse

17 metres high, dating back to 1883 with a beam that reached two nautical miles out to sea. The old light-keeper's house is now Smygehuk Lighthouse Hostel.

3. Smygehamn - celebrating 100 years in 2022

The harbour was built in the 1920s from what was originally a limestone quarry and is now a picturesque marina.

4. Köpmansmagasinet

The impressive warehouse Köpmansmagasinet was built in the early 1800s and according to rumour it was part of the smuggling rackets of the times. Nowadays you will find art, handcrafts, concerts and different events held here in the summer months.

5. Limestone industry - Östra Torp

The landscape around Smygehuk still has a lot of evidence of the once-booming limestone industry. There are eight cupola kilns in Östra Torp that look like something from a Star Wars film.

6. Limestone Kiln at Smygehuk

The oldest of the limestone kilns is in Smygehuk. It is a so-called shaft kiln that was built in the 1800s.

7. "The Embrace"

Rumour has it that actor Uma Thurman's grandmother modelled for Axel Ebbe's artwork "Famntaget" - known as "The Embrace" in English.

8. Akka

This is where Nils Holgersson bade farewell to the wild geese for their journey through Sweden, according to Selma Lagerlöf's story. This statue of the leading goose Akka was made by Erland Persson.

9. Euphoria for the senses

Listen to the sea in Monica Torrell's acoustic work, the sculpture 'And Back Again (the Sea)' and watch the horizon in Harry Moberg's sculpture 'Betraktaren'.

10. European Adders

On the coast between Böste and the harbour, and towards Köpmansmagasinet, there is a healthy population of European Adders. They are probably the last population along the South Coast. The snakes are protected and have their own snake fence.

11. Kungsdösarna

Stora and Lilla Kungsdösen are archaeological sites from the Stone Age. Stora Kungsdösen is one of Skåne's three double-passage graves.

12. Bålhög

Bålhög is a gravesite dating back to the Bronze Age.

13. Dellings hög

Dellings hög is a gravesite from the Bronze Age measuring 27 metres in diameter and 4 metres high.

14. Östra Torp Church

The village's medieval church was replaced with a newer bigger church in 1880 that burnt to the ground in 1909. A new church was built in 1911.

15. Smyge kärr

A little green oasis with frogs, lizards and toads.
