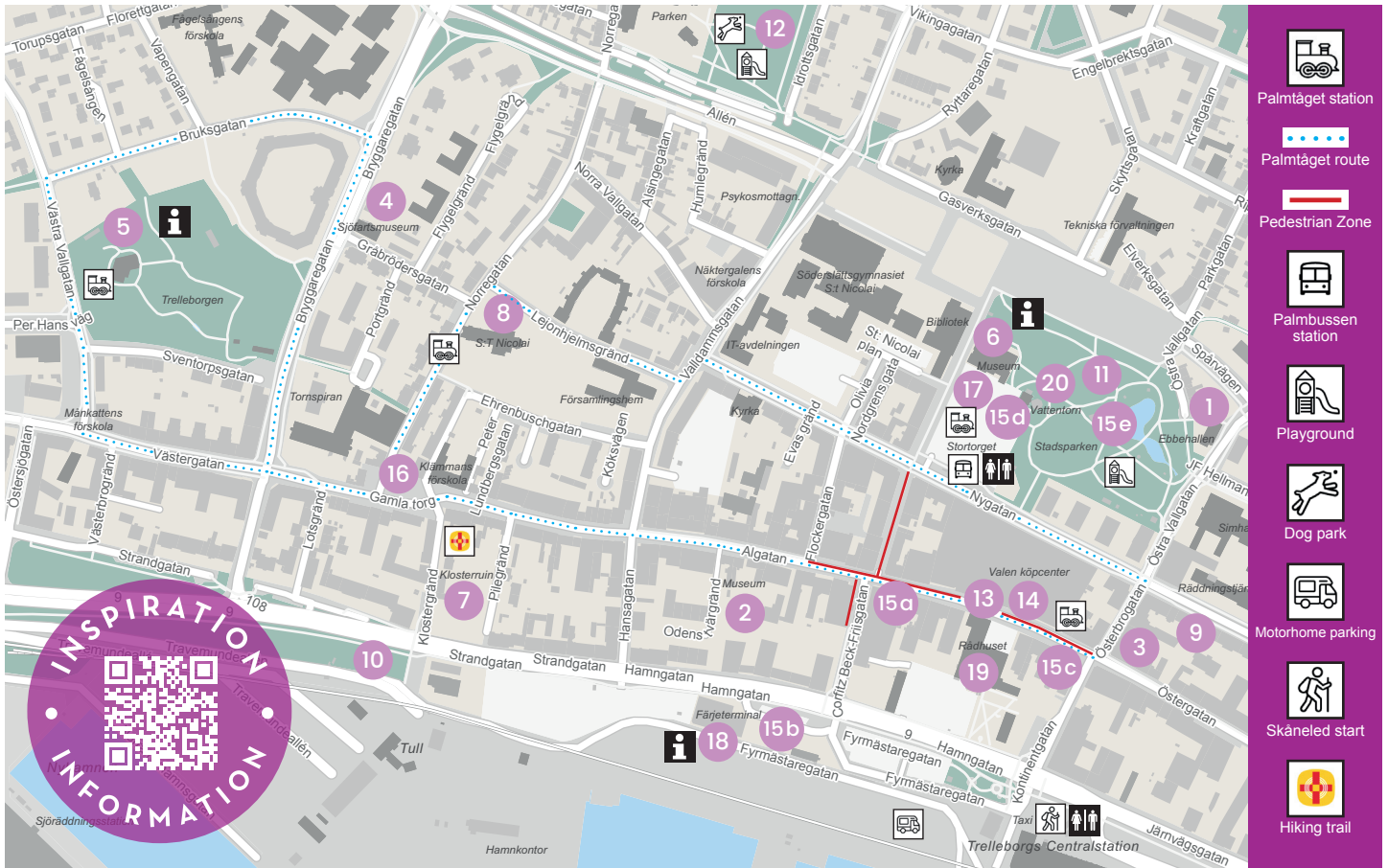


Trelleborg Guide

Trelleborg is Sweden's southernmost city, beautifully framed by the Baltic Sea's glistening waters and the golden fields of the Skåne Plains. The city was named after its Viking ring fortress that once stood here and that has been partially restored. The city centre attracts many visitors with its museums, historical buildings, public artworks, accessible shopping and opportunities to relax.



1. Axel Ebbe's Art Hall

Local artist Axel Ebbe's collected works including sculptures, paintings, graphics and drawings all in their own museum. Closed for renovations.

2. Borgquistska Hat Museum

Look at hats, caps and furs in a meticulously restored workshop from the 1800s. Tours by appointment only.

3. Hairdressing Museum

Hairdressing accessories and equipment from the 1800s onwards. Tours by appointment only.

4. Trelleborg Maritime Museum

History of local commercial fishing and shipping.

5. Trelleborgen - Viking Fortress

A reconstruction of a ring fortress from the Viking Age with a museum, shop, café, InfoPoint and Viking farm. The farm is outdoors and open all year round.

6. Trelleborg Museum

Cultural history museum with exhibitions, cinema, café and InfoPoint. The museum shop has unique souvenirs, toys and great gift ideas.

7. St. Katarina's Monastery

Ruins from the Franciscan monastery that was founded in 1267 and surrounding gardens.

8. St. Nicolai Church

Church from the mid-1200s.

9. Gingko Avenue

One of Europe's northernmost Gingko avenues.

10. Palm trees

Trelleborg's famous palms have been in the city since 1984. In the winter, they stay warm in their "Palm House" and in the summer they are distributed around the city.

11. Trelleborg City Park

Founded in 1896, with over 100 different tree species, a duck pond, outdoor stage, playground and art. Peacocks and hens roam freely!

12. The Generational Park

Playground, boule, skate park, outdoor gym and dog park.

13. Pedestrian Zone

The city's main shopping street. Cafés, fashion, services and restaurants.

14. Valen Shopping Mall

Mall with approximately 30 shops, supermarket and services.

15. Public Artworks

- a) Böst, Fountain by Fred Åberg
- b) Mural paintings, Johan Falkman (in Angkvarnen see no 18)
- c) Almost Halfway, Fred Åberg
- d) Sea Serpent, Axel Ebbe
- e) Small Creatures, R. Borselius

16. Old Town Square

Trelleborg's original centre with a church to the north and a monastery to the south. The city's oldest building is on the northwest corner.

17. Main Square

The heart of the city right by the City Park with Axel Ebbe's artwork "Sea Serpent" in the centre.

18. Hamngatan 9 "The Steam Mill"

The Steam Mill from 1897 has been demolished, but in this renovated building there is a hotel, InfoPoint, offices, etc.

19. Town Hall

Built in the 1860s as a primary school. In 1910 the building became the town hall and the gym is now a conference room.

20. Water Tower

58 metres high with a café and outdoor restaurant on the ground floor.

Palmtåget

Take a ride on the train for some city sightseeing.

Palmbussen

Double-decker bus that will take you between Trelleborg and Smygehuk. Bus stops and timetable available at visittrelleborg.se
