Welcome to Trelleborg

In Trelleborg on Skåne's south coast, you'll find inspiration, fun and experiences both large and small. The town is in the vibrant Öresund region and welcomes you with a continental feel and plenty of art, history and experiences for the whole family on its doorstep. You can easily continue on along the south coast or head inland to explore the countryside where you will find local crafts, locally grown culinary experiences, and peaceful nature. Welcome to Trelleborg - a village community with a metropolitan feel.

HERE, TIME HAS SHAPED one of Skåne's oldest towns, characterized by its maritime heritage and named after a Viking ring fortress. In 1988, traces of the fortress were discovered in Trelleborg, and suddenly the name of the town was explained - Trelleborg means ring fortress in Swedish. Today, Trelleborg is the world's only reconstructed **Viking fortress** ① and a popular tourist destination.

The Viking fortress has been partially reconstructed in the heart of the modern town, on its exact original site. It is surrounded by a park and a Viking farm, medieval houses, and a museum with an exciting multimedia exhibition "The Fortress by the Sea". In the summer, the Viking farm comes to life featuring a number of events, including the large-scale "Battle of Trelleborg."

THE TOWN CENTRE is pedestrian friendly, with a **walking street** ②③ featuring shops, restaurants and outdoor cafés. Enjoy the lively atmosphere, shop, or check out some of the town's popular artworks.

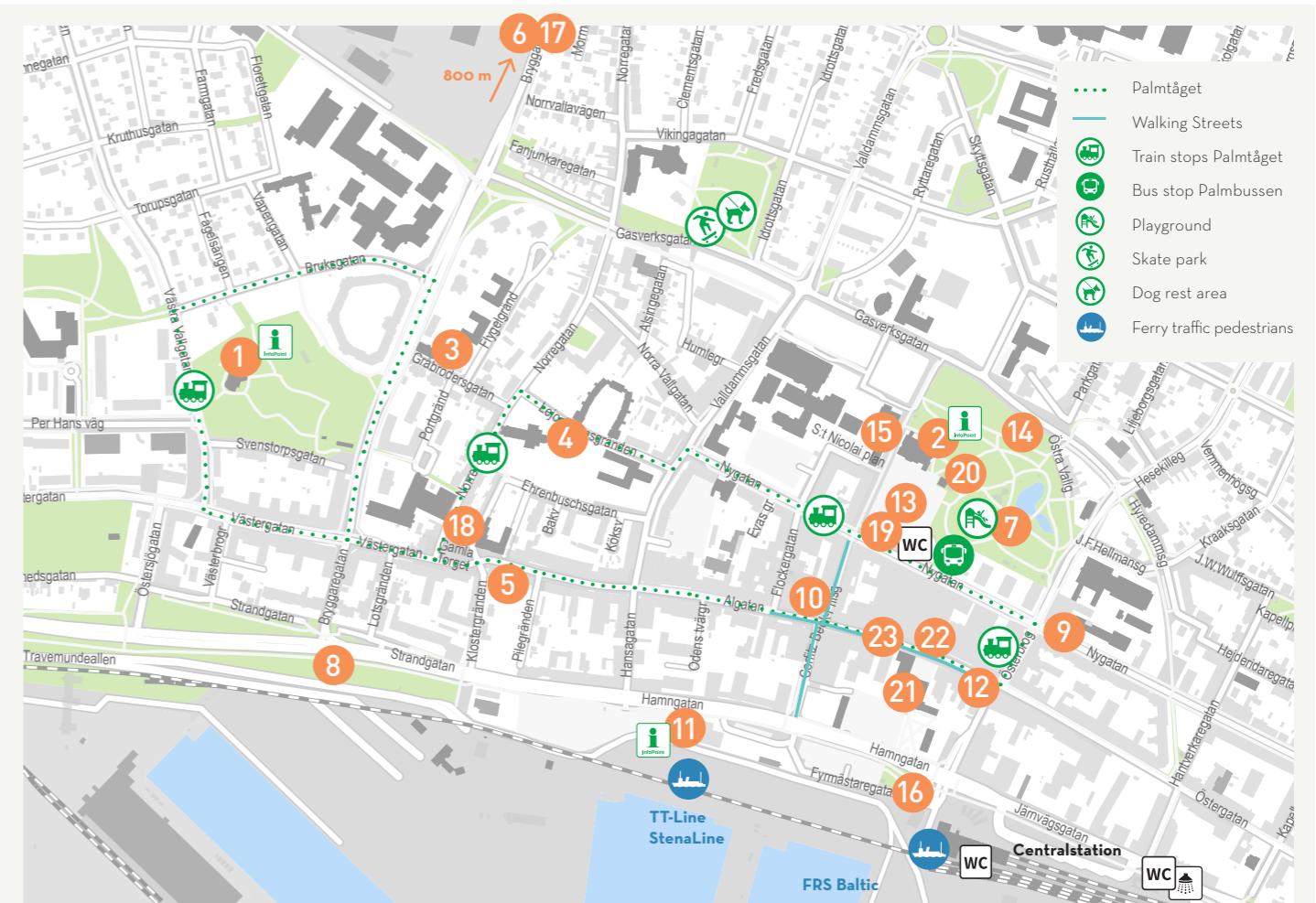
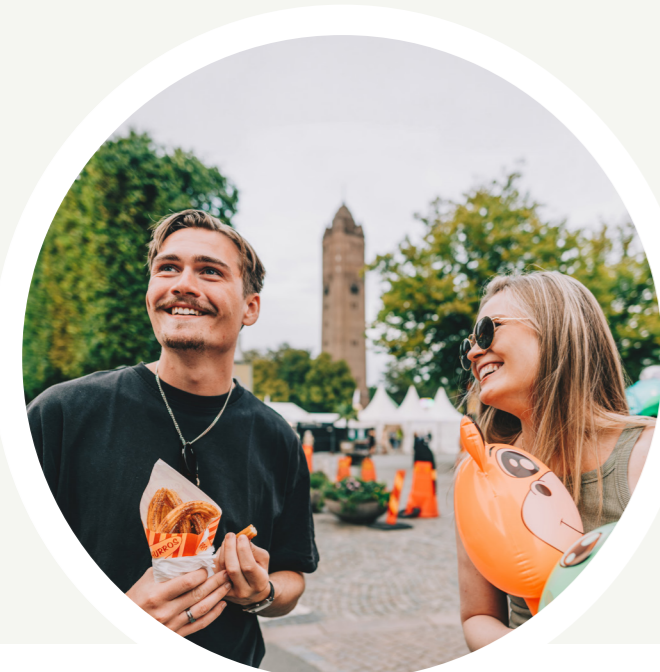
Trelleborg has a continental atmosphere where Danish, German and Swedish cultures meet. You may have heard Trelleborg being called the "city of palms"? Every summer, the continental feel is enhanced by the 110 **palm trees** ⑧ that are placed around the town.

AT STORTORGET - the town square - you will find several Trelleborg icons including **the old water tower** ⑫, **the statue "Sjöormen" (Sea Serpent)** ⑭ and **Trelleborg Museum** ②, featuring their "City Life" exhibit that gives visitors a picture of how Trelleborg has developed. The exhibit "Eye to Eye" tells the story of the Skateholm settlement, one of Skåne's oldest settlements, and lets you get to know the people who lived there 7,000 years ago.

Don't miss the live music concerts every Monday evening in the summer

Next to the town square is **Stadsparken** ⑦, the city's green oasis with over 100 different types of trees. There is also a playground, bird pond, sculptures, and lovely grassy areas for recreation and relaxation plus live music concerts held every Monday evening in the summer.

In the town centre, you can shop at the **Valen shopping mall** ⑮ or along the **walking street** ②③ where Signum, Milda Matilda, Puls and Annie's Home entice with elegance and style, while Rozzie and Bengtssons offer classic men's fashion. You can find flavourful goods and lovely gifts at Krydderiet and Homemix.



Museums

- 1. Trelleborgen**
Reconstructed Viking fortress with a museum, shop, café, InfoPoint and Viking farm. The outdoor area is open all year round.
- 2. Trelleborg Museum**
Cultural history museum with exhibitions, cinema, café and InfoPoint. The museum shop stocks unique souvenirs, toys and interesting presents.
- 3. Trelleborg Maritime Museum**
History of fishing and maritime activities in the region.

Churches

- 4. St Nicolai Church**
Church dating back to the 13th century.
- 5. St. Katarina Monastery Ruins & Monastery Garden**
Ruins of the Franciscan monks' monastery that was founded in 1267 plus Monastery gardens.
- 6. Northern Cemetary**
Trelleborg's northern cemetery that was opened in 1906. The impressive chapel (Norra Kapellet) from 1937 is inspired by the Pantheon in Rome.

Parks and Gardens

- 7. Trelleborg City Park**
Established in 1896 with over 100 different types of trees, a bird pond, outdoor stage, playground and art.

8. Palms

Palms have been a feature of Trelleborg since 1984. In winter, the 110 palms live in the Palm House and then placed out around the town in the summer.

9. Ginkgo Biloba

One of Europe's northernmost ginkgo avenues.

Sights

- 18. Trelleborg Old Town Square**
Trelleborg's old centre with the church in the north and the monastery in the south. The town's oldest house is in the northwest corner.
- 19. Trelleborg Town Square**
The heart of the city right by the city park and Axel Ebbe's artwork "Sea Serpent" in the middle.
- 20. Water Tower**
58 metres high with a café and outdoor seating on the ground floor.

21. Town Hall

Built in the 1860s as an elementary school. In 1910, the building became the town hall with the school gymnasium being transformed into a meeting room.

Shopping

- 22. Valen Mall**
Mall with around 30 shops, grocery store and services.
- 23. Walking Street**
The city's shopping street with cafes, fashion boutiques, services and restaurants.

Palmtåget is a Hop On-Hop Off train that takes you free-of-charge between Trelleborg's attractions. See the green markings on the map.

Palmbussen is a double-decker bus that takes you free-of-charge between Trelleborg and Smygehuk. Stops and timetable can be found on visittrelleborg.se
